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
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# Suggestions For Use



This Project Pack is intended to support the revised badgework programme that was agreed at the Beaver Leaders' Conference early in 2004. It replaces the Project Book and is designed to provide a wider range of options so that leaders may choose material that matches the age, ability and experience of the Beavers in their care. It is not intended to be prescriptive; leaders may choose what they want from the pack and supplement or replace it whenever they wish with material of their own. Some of the worksheets may also be suitable for work with cubs.

It will be apparent from looking at the table of contents that the Project Pack consists of ten separate sections, covering different areas of knowledge that we would expect a capable Beaver to have. Each section has at least four different worksheets which cover different aspects of the subject and may also require different levels of input from the child. Ultimately these sections may be expanded further.

It is neither required nor desirable that children complete all of the worksheets. Out of the ten sections there should be at least one worksheet completed from any seven of the sections. The choice may be made by the leader. At their discretion the views of each child may influence the choice. Most of the tasks may be taken further if time/opportunity/circumstances/enthusiasm permit. It is up to individuals to use the material in the best interests of the children.

You will notice that there are no answers or standards supplied. This is deliberate, so that leaders may decide for themselves what constitutes an appropriate achievement by the child. They are all different, so each leader is in the best position to decide what is right for each Beaver. There is no fixed time scale, but the project would take each Beaver at least three months.

The sheets are laser printed on bright white paper for the best results when scanning or photocopying. For ease and economy of handling, the pack is supplied in a lightweight folder. However, for longer life and best performance we recommend that sheets should

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## The Beaver - How it Looks

Take a look at some photographs of beavers. Notice the size and shape of the body, legs and tail. Notice the small eyes and ears, the shape of its snout and the pointed teeth. Why does it look like this? When you have looked at the photographs draw a picture of a beaver; make it big. Then colour your picture to make it look as real as you can. If you prefer, you can make a model of a beaver from clay or plasticine.

When you have found out where they live, choose a colour and mark the places accurately on the map.




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## The Beaver - The Lodge





You will need to think about getting faster and getting stronger. After at least four weeks of practise, you swim the same course again getting someone to time it. If you have improved well done! If not, you can practise more and try again. In fact, you can have as many tries as you like. When you think that you have succeeded, try to fill in the answers and draw a picture of yourself swimming.

Choose a course - say along the side of the playground or a football pitch. Count how many times you can complete the course in 10 minutes. Stop if you feel unwell. Call each time a lap. 



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
